- Almost half of the total NSW population of people living with HIV and about a quarter of Australia's HIV positive population lives within South Eastern Sydney Local Health District.
- General practitioners play a crucial role in the NSW HIV Strategy goal to virtually eliminate HIV transmission in NSW by 2020.
- Close to 50% of new HIV diagnoses are made in general practice in NSW, increasing the offer and uptake of testing in this setting is vital.
- HIV is now considered a manageable chronic condition requiring lifelong treatment.

The aim of this course is to provide general practitioners and nurses in the South Eastern Sydney Local Health District with an update on strategies available for the prevention of HIV transmission, focussing on prevention strategies including testing, treatment, PEP and PrEP.

After attending this course participants will be able to:

- Identify appropriate patients to routinely test for HIV and perform HIV diagnostic testing.
- Implement a range of HIV Prevention Strategies .
- Discuss the goals of HIV Therapy.
- Describe emerging PrEP safety, efficacy and usage data.
